More than 20 beautiful gardens ornament the grounds at Cylburn, including themed, memorial, habitat, and traditional gardens. Cylburn's gardeners and volunteers make sure the gardens are beautiful year-round. The Cylburn collection of trees and shrubs dates back to the late 1800s. Some of the original trees, like the grove of Japanese Maples, still stand. Discover native, nonnative, unique, and champion trees. Cylburn is one of the largest wooded areas in Baltimore City, making it an important habitat for local plants and animal life. It is a great place for birding and wildflower enthusiasts. Discover the forest and wildlife first hand on more 3.5 miles of trails.

- Exit Northern Parkway West
- At first stoplight, turn left onto Greenspring Avenue
- Continue past traffic light at the intersection of Cylburn Avenue and Greenspring Avenue
